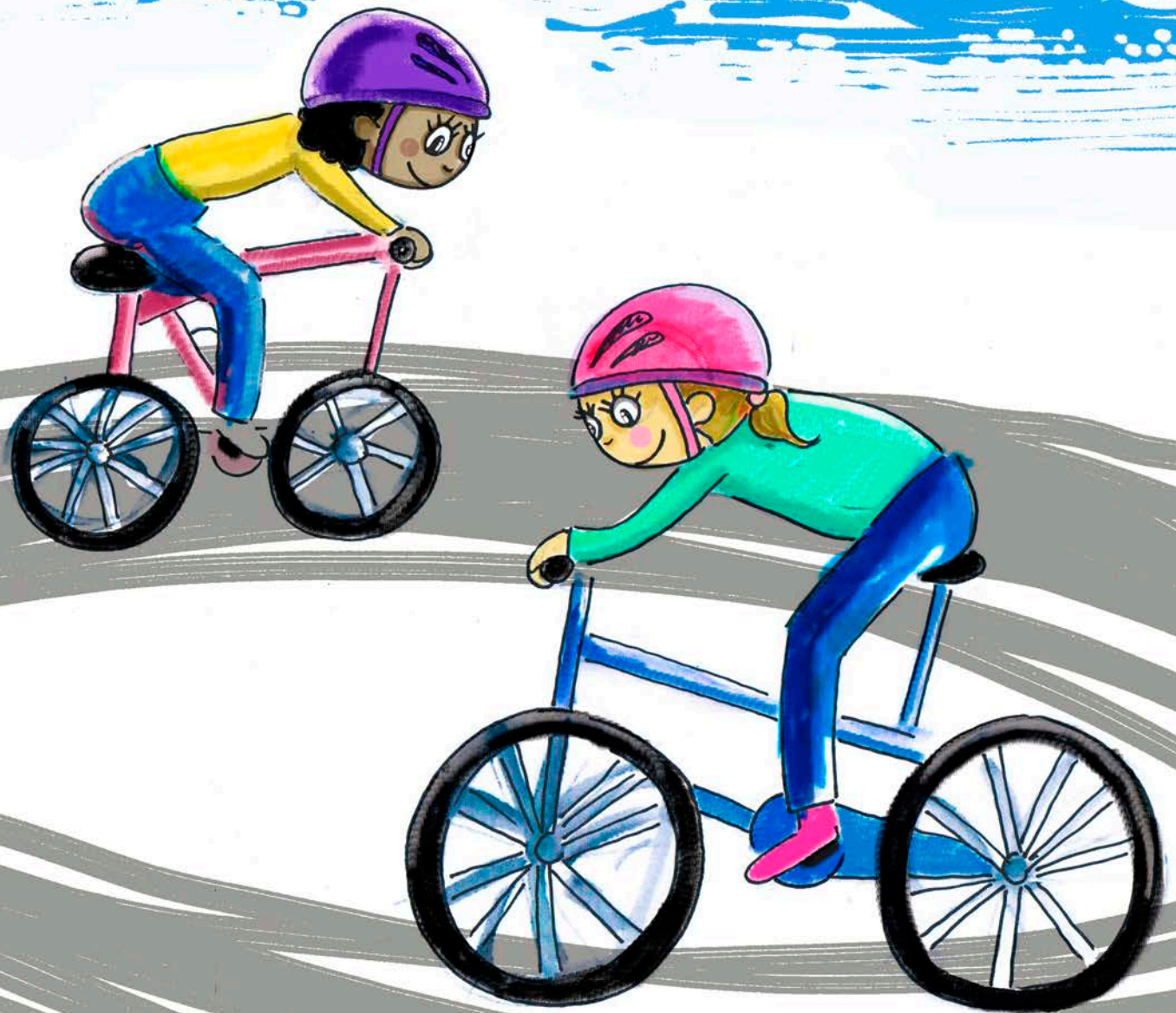

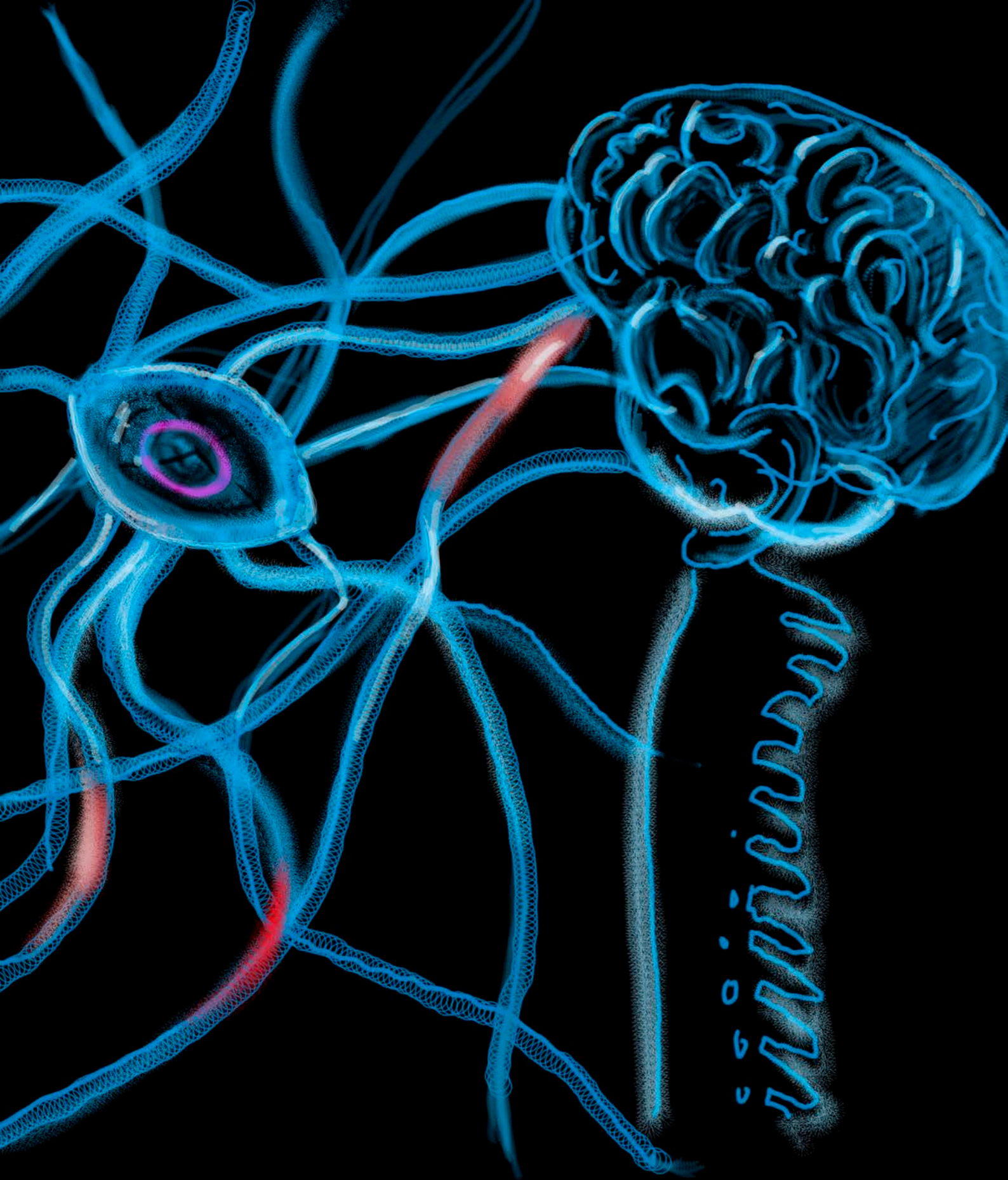
MY MOM WORKS IN THE HOSPITAL.

OR THEY GET IN ACCIDENTS.

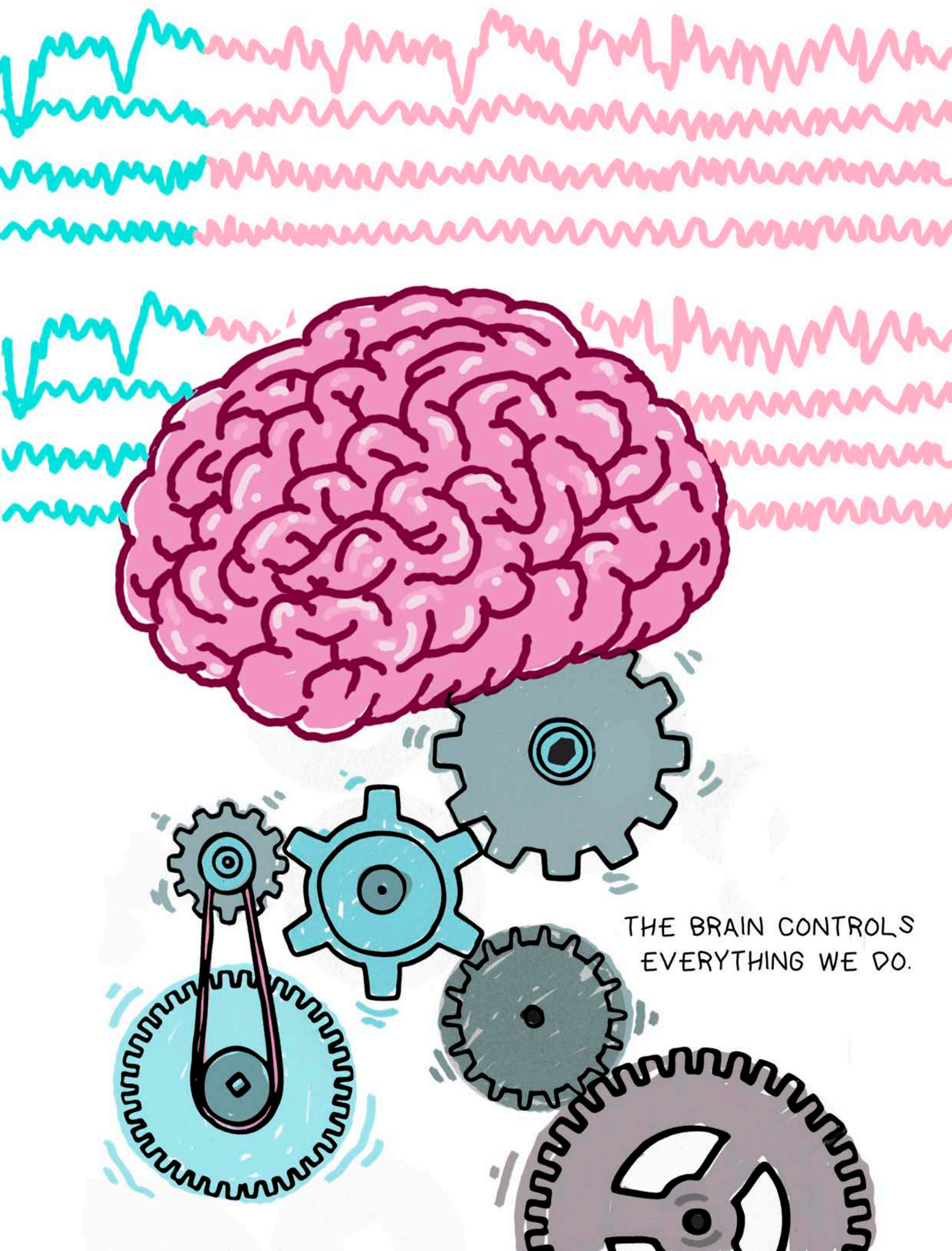


I LOVE TO GO TO SCHOOL BECAUSE

EVERYTHING WE DO.



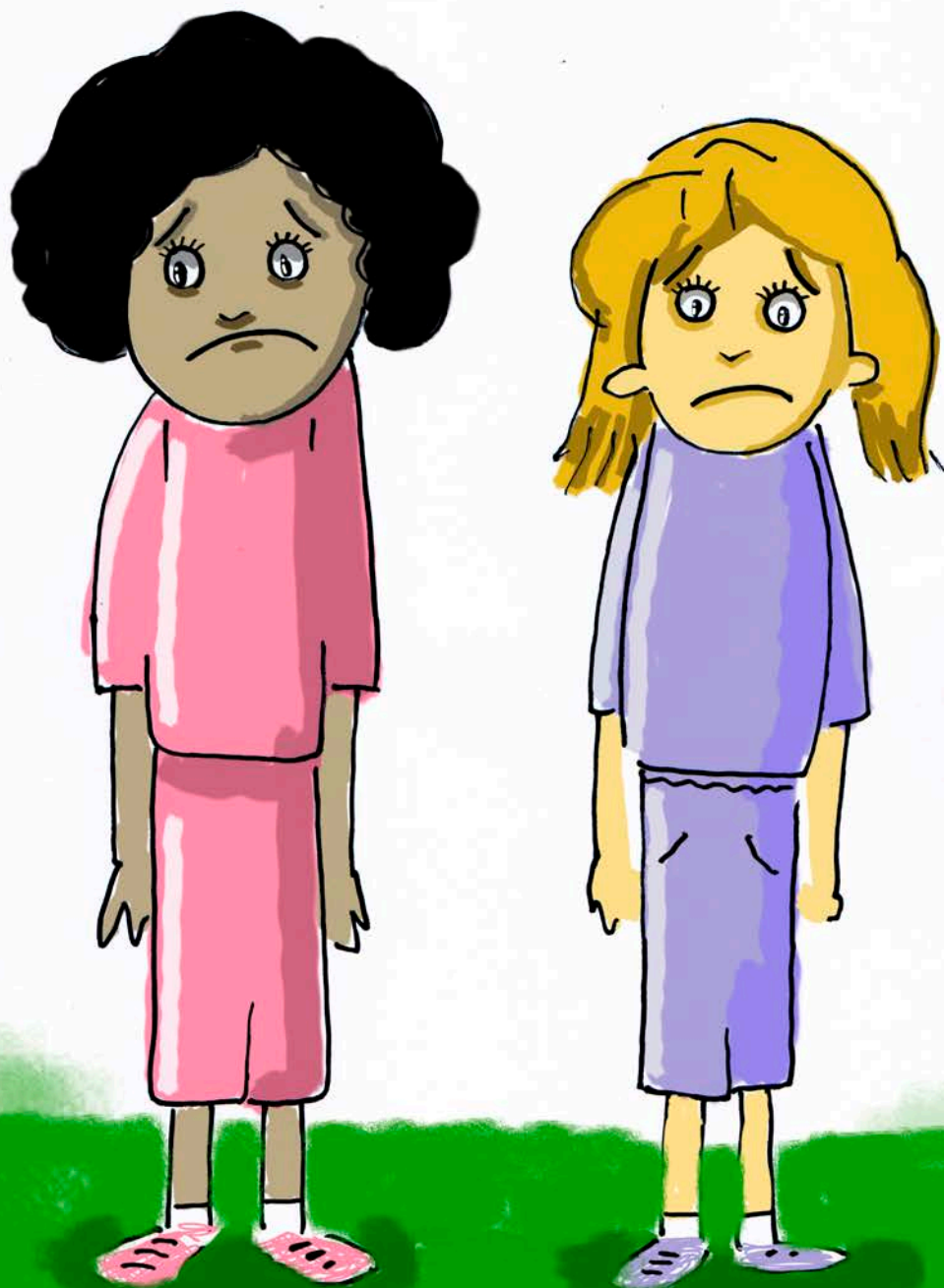
THE SPINE HOLDS US UPRIGHT.
